

Annual Scholarship

Commitment \$2,000 - \$5,000 annually

An annual scholarship will be awarded to a high-achieving SCM student to help defray the costs of attending college. ASF will have an opportunity to meet and engage with its scholarship recipient.

Case Competition Sponsorship

Commitment \$10,000 per competition

SCM students regularly participate in case competitions at conferences and universities. ASF support will defray the cost of travel, event registration, and resources for the student team and faculty leader.

Commitment \$15,000 annually
